

### "Time Keeps on Slipping"

Time is one of those strange things in life. The younger you are, time seems to slow down because you are always anxious for the next thing: Christmas, turning 12, driving, high school graduation and so on. Since time is working against what you are looking forward to, it always seems to go painfully slow. Then somewhere along the way, it seems like the script get completely switched and time begins to pick up momentum and begins to work against you by going fast. As you become older, time once again is your enemy because we have much less than we did when we were younger, but now it is moving ever-increasingly faster because the amount of time you have left is quickly fleeting. Like the song from my younger days says, "Time keeps on slipping, slipping into the future..."

I can remember during my final basketball game as a high school senior. That season, we finally had a decent team and had a good regular season record. We were headed into the tournament and were ranked as the number 1 seed in our bracket. As a result, we were to play the bottom seed from another region. Things looked good for us. While we warmed up, we joked amongst ourselves about how small the other team looked and fully expected to run over them. Well, my last clear memory of that night is looking up at the scoreboard with only ten seconds left in the game and with us still being ten points down. It wasn't until that point than I truly realized that we were really going to lose that game. Up until then, I just knew that we would pull out a win somehow, but time ran out and we had to shake all those little fella's hands after having been handily beaten.

This past week I crossed a major milestone in my life. I crossed over to the age of 60. Crossing over sounds a little bit morbid I guess, but this marker seems much more significant than the others thus far. Now, for some of you younger folks that sounds as old a Methuselah, and for others who I appreciate more and more, I'm still a young man. Time is relative according to your own frame of reference and is indeed slipping, slipping...

I guess I have been thinking about time more and more these days. Turning 60 will cause you to reflect, but so does the world events of recent days. The

brutality leading to the war in Israel, along with the ongoing war in Ukraine, coupled with some recent earthquakes, it can't help but cause me to once again reflect on time. We have no idea how much time on this earth that we may have individually, or when God will begin wrapping things up in precise accordance to His timetable. It is too easy to live as if we will always have time to do the important things in life, but we know that is simply not the case. Paul challenged the Ephesians to, "redeem the time, because the days are evil" (Eph. 5:16). We can't get more time, but we can leverage whatever time we have left for the Kingdom of God. Let's choose to love and give more generously especially to the least among us, to express appreciation for kindnesses shown to us, to look for ways to show kindness even to those undeserving, and to share the goods news of Christ with those we encounter.

Time is easy to take for granted, in fact, it is easy to simply wish away time as we anxiously wait for the next thing. Yet, making an effort to be conscientious about each moment given to us can allow us to redeem our time. But much like my last basketball game, time will eventually expire for all of us here on this earth. We can choose to utilize whatever time we have in a way that honors the Lord and that demonstrates an appreciation for every good and perfect gift that the Father provides (James 1:17). Time is indeed "slipping, slipping into the future" but for now there is still some left for us to use for God's glory and for others' good. Let's look for opportunities to do that!
